AUXILIARY PRESIDENT MARY KVAAL

Hello everyone,

May is a busy month for The American Legion Families. We are centered on honoring fallen service members through Memorial Day activities, wearing red poppies, and observing Armed Forces Day. Our legion Auxiliary also has a special event in May. The NSP Auxiliary 39 chapter celebrates 100 years of contributing to our veterans' needs.

The North Saint Paul Auxiliary is part of American Legion Post 39 in North St. Paul, Minnesota. The Auxiliary Unit 39 was officially chartered on May 25, 1926. It formed about 7 years after the post itself (Post 39 was founded in 1919 by World War I veterans).

Early Role.

From the beginning, the Auxiliary consisted largely of spouses, daughters, granddaughters of veterans, and women closely connected to Legion members. All Auxiliaries are now open to male spouses of veterans as well.

We supported the post's mission by assisting veterans and their families, helping with community relief efforts, organizing charitable and patriotic activities, and this is what we continue today.

Over time, the North St. Paul Auxiliary developed its own identity while still supporting the Legion. Its activities have included:

- Sponsoring youth leadership programs like Girls State
- Organizing holiday events (such as children's Christmas parties)
- Supporting local schools (e.g., independent district 622 and others)
- Assisting veteran-focused organizations like the Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans (MACV)
- Working with VA support centers and community services

These reflect the broader Auxiliary mission statewide and nationally: service to veterans, children, and the community.

We are currently 137 members strong. With the help of all these wonderful, dedicated people and the people of the NSP Legion, in the last year we have donated over \$15,000.00 dollars in cash and supplies to multiple organizations. I am so proud to be a part of this group.

As we move through May, please look at our website and Facebook for the events that will be held on Memorial Day. We will be going to four cemeteries and a service at the NSP Memorial wall.

This year we also celebrate America's 250th birthday. The Legion Families will be hosting a celebration for both the anniversary and the birthday on Sunday, June 7th, 2026, from noon until 3. Our theme: baseball, hot dogs, apple pie, and Chevrolet. More details will be posted as we approach the date. We will be serving up those above-mentioned delicacies and hope to have some special guests stop and visit.

Since May is also national Poppy month, I'll give you a little heads up on the topic. The poppy first became a symbol of remembrance following the publication of the 1915 poem In Flanders Fields by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, who noticed the red flowers blooming over the churned-up soil of soldiers' graves in Belgium. We do not ask you to "buy" a Poppy and will happily hand you a Poppy to wear. We will happily take your donation, but we do not ask for it. Millions of red crepe-paper poppies, handmade by veterans as part of their therapeutic rehabilitation, are distributed across the country. Donations go directly to assist veterans in need within our communities.

We've recently added a virtual racing game to our bingo coverall game. The first column to fill up with numbers determines the winner of the race. This new feature allows us to sell multiple virtual racing games throughout the bingo session, resulting in multiple winners at the end of coverall, with additional payouts up to \$500.00 for those who purchase virtual racing tickets.

As we approach the end of the State Calendar year for charitable gaming, I'm projecting that we'll achieve a 4-Star Rating and donate over \$40,000 to Veterans causes, scholarships, and the community.

Looking ahead to the State 2026-2027 Calendar year, I'll be proposing that the general membership consider approving the addition of handicap door controls to the building's north entrance doors and restrooms, which will come out of our gambling funds. This will enable us to add more handicapped parking spaces in front of the building, making our facility more accessible to our elderly members.

None of this would be possible without your support and the loyalty of our customers. Thank you for your continued dedication to our mission!

* **Seafood Raffles with Virtual Racing***: Every Thursday at 5:00 p.m. We will be raffling off roughly 6(\$40 value) packages each week along with virtual racing. Take advantage of our double-up for a buck deal at the bar and try your luck at winning some seafood and extra cash.

* **Friday Night Meat Raffles***: Every Friday at 4:00 p.m., with tickets starting at \$1.00. We will be raffling off roughly 18 packages each week. Virtual Racing starts at 4:00 p.m. during the meat raffle. Tickets are \$1.00 each, with multiple payouts ranging from \$50 to \$500.00.

Bingo has been picking up, and our electronic handhelds are a hot item. We started off with 40 in December and now we are up to 50 machines, and looking at 60.

We have three cash raffles weekly here at Post 39.

Wednesday is a \$5.00 raffle ticket (200 tickets) "Hump Day" which pays out \$700.00.

Friday is a \$1.00 raffle ticket (800 tickets) "Lucky Buck" which pays out \$500.00.

Sunday is a \$5.00 raffle ticket (200 tickets) "Sunday-Funday" which pays out \$700.00.

We have 4 \$1 boxes, 3 \$2 boxes, a \$5 box, and 12 Etabs with Booty Bingo.

Don't forget we have two bingo sessions each week. Tuesday's session starts at 6 p.m., and on Saturdays, we start at 4 p.m. We have 10 games 3 each session, with the last one being a \$1,000 coverall, with a \$200 consolation prize if bingo is not reached in the pre-determined number of balls.
